LED Strip Lighting Upgrades for Hospitality Spaces

1. Layer Light in the Dining Room

Overhead-only lighting leaves a dining room flat and food unappealing, so add layers like cove lighting in a warm 2700K to 3000K range. Specify a CRI of 90 or above, and use tunable or RGB strips to shift the mood between lunch, dinner, and special events.



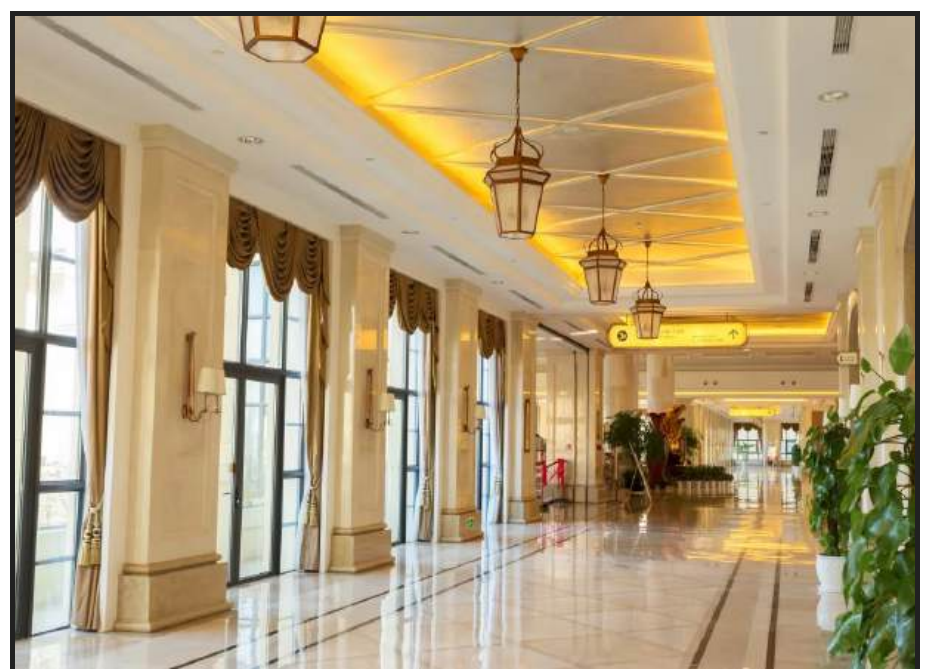
2. Light the Back Bar and Accent Moments

Strips beneath glass shelves make bottles and glassware appear to float while helping staff navigate. Keep the back bar in the 2700K to 3000K range with high CRI, and extend accent lighting to feature walls and lit alcoves.



3. Set the Tone in Hotel Lobbies

A lobby is a first impression, so warm, layered light signals comfort before guests reach the front desk. Use cove lighting, backlit feature walls, and under-desk strips at 2700K to 3000K, carried consistently through corridors and elevator areas.



4. Specify the Full System

The strip is only one piece, so spec the whole system, including drivers, mounting channels, and the right lens to avoid dots and hot spots. For runs longer than 10 to 15 feet, choose 24-volt over 12-volt to prevent dimming at the far end.
